8.1 Exhibitions/Workshops/Mass Awareness Activities, NGO Activities, printing of pamphlets, booklets, collection and dissemination of information and conducting Rajbhasha Hindi Diwas event.

Environmental events like **Earth Hour, Earth Day, World Water Day, World Environmental day and National Pollution Prevention Day** were celebrated during the FY 2015-16.

World Environment Day was observed on June 5, 2015 at Zonal Office, Bengaluru to promote awareness and to instil sense of responsibility among all staff. WED is a "Festival of the Environment" which is a symbolic celebration to save our planet. Technical presentation and video on theme were also arranged during the occasion.
