**Sub.: Directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 -Show cause Notice thereof.**

WHEREAS, the Central Government has notified the standards for discharge of environmental pollutants from various categories of industries under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules framed thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is obligatory on the part of industries to install and operate Effluent Treatment plant (ETP) to comply with the effluent discharge standards as notified under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the Rules framed thereunder and also to meet the consent conditions granted by State Pollution Control Board (SPCB)/ Pollution Control Committees (PCCs); and

WHEREAS, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of Paryavaran Suraksha Samiti Vs Union of India & Others dated 22/02/2017 directed that no industry which requires "consent to operate" from the concerned Pollution Control Board, is permitted to function, unless it has a functional effluent treatment plant, which is capable to meet the prescribed norms for removing the pollutants from the effluent, before it is discharged; and

WHEREAS, a team of officers from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), Delhi and Haryana State Pollution Control Board inspected M/s Parv Tex India, Bapoli Road, Village Behrampur, Tehsil Bapoli, District Panipat, Haryana (herein after referred as the Unit) on May 31, 2018 to assess the adequacy of the existing pollution control measures; and

WHEREAS, the inspecting team found the Unit operational and observed the following:

1. The unit is a Yarn / Textile processing industry involving bleaching, dyeing, printing, colouring of textile / yarn.
2. The unit has not installed flow meter at the bore well and records of water consumption are not maintained,
3. The unit has installed an evaporator of capacity 100 KL per Day to treat the trade effluent. However, the unit failed to provide any satisfactory information about disposal of evaporation process residue / sludge. The unit could not show any storage or disposal evidence (Hazardous Waste manifest) of evaporation process residue / sludge which indicates that the unit may not be operating

its effluent treatment system (evaporator) on regular basis and hence may be practicing unauthorised discharge of effluent.

4. The unit failed to show Hazardous Waste Authorisation granted by Haryana State Pollution Control Board during inspection.
5. The unit has not provided any dust removing system in the textile processing area. The whole processing area was observed covered heavily under suspended particulate matter generated due to textile / yarn processing.


WHEREAS, the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, vide Notifications No. S. O. 157 (E) of 27.02.1996 and S. O. 730 (E) dated 10.07.2002, has delegated the powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board, to issue directions to any industry or any local body or any other authority for violations of the standards and rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 and amendment thereof.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in exercise of powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, notice is hereby served to the Unit (**M/s Parv Tex India, Bapoli Road, Village Behrampur, Tehsil Bapoli, District Panipat, Haryana**) to show cause why the Unit should not be directed to close down all plant operations until following directions are complied:

1. The unit shall install flow meter at the bore well and shall maintain proper records of water consumption.
2. The unit shall maintain log book of Effluent Treatment System (evaporator) containing details of quantity of waste water treated and quantity of evaporation residue / sludge generated.
3. The Unit shall manage & dispose hazardous waste along with proper record maintenance in accordance with Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016.
4. The unit shall obtain Hazardous Waste Authorisation from Haryana State Pollution Control Board.
5. The unit shall provide proper suspended particulate matter (dust) removing arrangement from its textile / yarn processing area.

The compliance of above direction (notice) shall be submitted to CPCB within 30 days of the receipt of the directions. In case of failure to comply with the said directions necessary action as deemed fit under the provision of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 will be taken by CPCB.


