Directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986

WHEREAS, Textile dyeing and bleaching industries are identified as one of the Grossly Polluting industries (GPIs) which have been discharging environmental pollutants directly or indirectly into the ambient air and water, having potential threat to cause adverse effect on the water and air quality; and

WHEREAS, the Central Government has notified general discharge standards of environmental pollutants from various categories of industries under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules framed there under; and

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, vide Notifications No.S.O.157(E) of 27.02.1996 and S.O.730(E) dated 10.07.2002, has delegated the powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board, to issue directions to any industry or any local body or any other authority for violations of the standards and rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 and amendment thereof; and

WHEREAS, M/s Rama Tex Process House Pvt. Ltd., 93/2, Rithani, Delhi Road, Meerut (U.P.) (here in after referred as 'the unit') is involved in processing and dyeing of fabrics; and

WHEREAS, inspection of the unit was conducted on 21st May, 2018 and was found non-complying with stipulated norms; and

WHEREAS, CPCB issued closure directions dated 7th August, 2018 under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 for compliance of the following directions:

1. The unit shall close down all manufacturing operations immediately.
2. The unit shall close down all bypass arrangements immediately.
3. The unit shall submit time bound action plan duly validated by a reputed government recognized institution and carry out upgradation/augmentation of ETP to meet prescribed standards.
4. The unit shall not resume operation till above directions are complied with and without written permission of CPCB.

WHEREAS, the unit replies vide letters dated 12th November, 2018 and 27th November, 2018 were examined and following observations are made:

1. The unit has submitted adequacy report from CPPRI indicating adequate system.
2. The unit has also submitted self-certificate of closure and proof of sealing of bypass arrangements.

WHEREAS, the unit was re-inspected by CPCB on 17th December, 2018 as per CPCB guidelines for revocation of closure directions in order to verify the closing of all bypass arrangements; and

WHEREAS, CPCB constituted a Three-Member Committee vide office order dated 27th September, 2017 having representative from CPCB and MoEF & CC for examination and recommendation for revocation of the closure direction issued by CPCB; and

WHEREAS, the Three Member Committee in its meeting held on 16th January, 2019 examined the replies dated 12th November, 2018 and 27th November, 2018 and recommended that:

1. The unit is recommended for revocation in view of recommendations of adequacy report prepared by Central Pulp and Paper Research Institute, Saharanpur.
2. The unit shall start its operation with valid permission from Central Ground Water Authority.
3. Performance assessment of treatment system including analysis of treated effluent by the same reputed government institute within 60 days of resumption of operation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the above and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the unit, **M/s Rama Tex Process House Pvt. Ltd., 93/2, Rithani, Delhi Road, Meerut (U.P.)** is hereby issued directions as follows:

1. The unit shall resume operation only after obtaining valid permission from Central Ground Water Authority and shall immediately inform CPCB regarding resumption of operation.
2. The unit shall submit performance assessment report of its treatment system including analysis of treated effluent by the same reputed government institute within 60 days of resumption of operation.

In case of non-compliance of the above directions, CPCB will be constrained to initiate appropriate action against the unit without giving any further notice in accordance with the provision of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
