Sub.: Directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986- reg.

WHEREAS, Pesticide units are identified as one of the 17 categories of highly polluting industries which have been discharging environmental pollutants directly or indirectly into the ambient air and water, having potential threat to cause adverse effect on the water and air quality; and

WHEREAS, the Central Government has notified the standards for discharge of environmental pollutants from various categories of industries under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules framed there under; and

WHEREAS, there is need to inculcate habit of self-monitoring within the industries for complying with the prescribed standards and this can be achieved by the methods like installing online effluent monitoring devices; and

WHEREAS, the unit was inspected by official of CPCB Regional Directorates, Kolkata on April 23, 2019 under OCEMS surveillance based on the offline of OCEMS during January 15 – February 15, 2019 and observed the following:

1. The effluent sample collected from ETP outlet solar evaporation pond (SEP) is not meeting the norms w.r.t BOD - $804 > 30$ mg/l, COD – $2787 > 250$ mg/l, Phenol $6.98 > 1.0$ mg/l and O&G $36.50 > 10$ mg/l is not meeting the norms notified under E(P) rules, 1986.
2. As such solar evaporation pond is not allowed as per E (P) rule, however water is getting evaporated and no discharge found during inspection.
3. It was observed that, OCEMS was defunct during inspection of the unit on April 23, 2019, Web Camera connectivity has not observed as per IT division report dated May 14, 2019.
4. The unit has not provided stack monitoring porthole and monitoring platform on the boiler stack.
5. Used chemical containers, poly bags and scraps were kept in scattered manner and housekeeping of the plant was not satisfactory.

WHEREAS, closure direction under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 was issued to the Unit vide letter dated May 22, 2019 based on the above stated observations of the inspecting team; and

WHEREAS, the Unit vide letter dated June 10, 2019 submitted point wise compliance statement w.r.t. closure direction issued by CPCB and requested for revoke of the closure directions dated May 22, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Unit submitted self-certificate vide letter dated June 07, 2019 which states that the Unit has closed its plant operation from 24.05.2019 in response to CPCB closure direction; and

WHEREAS, the Unit has submitted Adequacy report of Effluent Treatment Plant dated November 13, 2019 from Department of Civil Engineering, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi which states that the ETP of the Unit is adequate; and

WHEREAS, CPCB constituted a Three-member committee vide office order dated 03.10.2017 having representative(s) from CPCB and MoEF&CC for examination and recommendation for revocation of the closure direction issued by CPCB; and



WHEREAS, the three-member committee in its meeting held on 09.12.2019 examined the compliance report submitted by the Unit and recommended that the closure direction issued to the Unit on May 22, 2019 may be revoked with a condition that the Unit shall submit performance assessment report of the Zero Liquid Discharge from Department of Civil Engineering, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi within 60 days of start of its operation; and

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, vide Notifications No. S. O. 157 (E) of 27.02.1996 and S. O. 730 (E) dated 10.07.2002, has delegated the powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board, to issue directions to any industry or any local body or any other authority for violations of the standards and rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 and amendment thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of powers vested to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, and in view of the recommendations made by the revocation committee on 09.12.2019, the direction issued under the Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 to the Unit (**M/s. Suvochem Industries Pvt. Ltd., S-3/ A-19, Jagatpur Industrial Estate, Jagatpur, District Cuttack – 754021, Odisha**), vide letter dated May 22, 2019 is hereby revoked with condition that:

1. The Unit shall submit performance assessment report of the Zero Liquid Discharge system from Department of Civil Engineering, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi within 60 days of start of its operation.
2. The Unit shall inform CPCB immediately upon resumption of operation.

In the event of failure to comply with the above stated directions, the revocation order shall automatically stand withdrawn and the closure order shall again become operative. The Unit shall ensure compliance with the norms. In case of non-compliance by the Unit action as deemed fit under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 shall be taken.
