**Directions under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 to Delhi State Industrial & Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. in the case of improper Management of Solid Waste in Patparganj Industrial Area**

**WHEREAS**, the Central Government has notified the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 (herein after referred as SWM Rules, 2016) notified under Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 for proper management and handling of Solid Wastes;

**WHEREAS** Delhi State Industrial & Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (herein after referred as DSIIDC) is an agency responsible to establish, operate, maintain and manage industrial estates under the provisions of Delhi Industrial Development, Operation and Maintenance Act, 2010, which include handling and disposal of industrial solid waste of non-hazardous nature generated within industrial estates under its jurisdiction;

**WHEREAS** DSIIDC is a bulk waste generator as defined under SWM Rules, 2016, which means and includes buildings occupied by the Central government departments or undertakings, State government departments or undertakings, local bodies, public sector undertakings or private companies, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, colleges, universities, other educational institutions, hostels, hotels, commercial establishments, markets, places of worship, stadia and sports complexes having an average waste generation rate exceeding 100kg per day;

**WHEREAS**, as per Rule 4 of SWM Rules, 2016 stipulates that waste generator shall not throw, burn or bury the solid waste generated by him, on streets, open public spaces;

**WHEREAS** a team of officials from CPCB have inspected the Patparganj Industrial area on 12/06/2017 and observed that solid waste and residues of burnt industrial wastes was dumped indiscriminately in open areas, un-used plots, drains and along the road sides. A large quantity of solid waste of industrial origin was dumped in open site of nursery developed during Common Wealth Games, 2010.

**WHEREAS** Government of India has taken up various programs under Swachh Bharat Mission to create awareness among various stakeholders to improve cleanliness and it is the responsibility of all the stakeholders to implement programs as required under the provisions of SWM Rules, 2016 notified under E(P) Act, 1986.


**WHEREAS** the Hon'ble NGT in its order dated 22/12/2016 in the matter of 199 of 2014, Almitra H.Patel and ors. Vs Uoi and others has directed that "...any States/UTs, local authorities, concessionaires, facility operators, any stakeholders, generators of waste and any person who

violates or fails to comply with the Rules of 2016 in the entire country and the directions contained in his judgment shall be liable for penal action in accordance with Section-15 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and shall also be liable to pay environmental compensation in terms of sections 15 & 17 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010 to the extent determined by the Tribunal;

**WHEREAS** the Central Government vide Notification No. S.O. 157(E) of February 27, 1996 and S.O. 730 (E) dated July 10, 2002, has delegated the powers under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board (herein after referred to as CPCB), to issue directions to any industry or any local or any other authority for the violation of the standards and rules, notified under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and amendments thereof;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in exercise of the powers vested under the Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, directions are hereby issued to make necessary arrangements for collection and lifting of all accumulated solid waste from vacant plots, drains, along road sides within the Patparganj industrial area and also arrange for segregation of the same and transport to either Waste to Energy plant, landfill facility or C&D waste recycling facility depending on type of waste collected within 5 days from date of issuance of these directions;

Action taken report in this regard shall be submitted by June 29, 2017. In the event of failure to comply with above directions, appropriate action would be initiated in accordance with the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 19786 and amendments thereof, without any further notice.
