Sub: Directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 -reg.

WHEREAS, the Textile industries are identified as one of the Grossly Polluting Industries which have been discharging effluents directly or indirectly on land and into water, having potential threat to cause adverse effect on land and the ambient water quality; and

WHEREAS, the Central Government has notified the standards for discharge of environmental pollutants from various categories of industries under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules framed thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is obligatory on the part of industries to install and operate Effluent Treatment plant (ETP) to comply with the effluent discharge standards as notified under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the Rules framed thereunder and also to meet the consent conditions granted by State Pollution Control Board (SPCB)/ Pollution Control Committees(PCCs); and

WHEREAS, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of Paryavaran Suraksha Samiti Vs Union of India & Others dated 22/02/2017 directed that no industry which requires "consent to operate" from the concerned Pollution Control Board, is permitted to function, unless it has a functional effluent treatment plant, which is capable to meet the prescribed norms for removing the pollutants from the effluent, before it is discharged; and

WHEREAS, a team of officers from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), Delhi inspected M/s. AAA Spinners, E-33, Industrial Area, District Panipat, Haryana (herein after referred as the Unit) on March 28, 2019 to assess the adequacy of the existing pollution control measures; and

WHEREAS, the inspecting team found that the Unit was operational and observed the following:

1. The ETP of the Unit was operational and the analysis result of treated effluent sample was not meeting the prescribed standards for effluent discharge w.r.t parameters COD (290 mg/l > 250 mg/l) & BOD (113 mg/l > 30 mg/l).
2. The Unit has not applied for the permission from CGWA for ground water extraction.
3. The Unit has not maintained logbook records for fresh water consumption from bore well.
4. The Unit has provided a freshwater pipeline, after tube settler, in the line between tube settler and dual media filter.
5. The boiler ash was found dumped outside the gate of industry.



WHEREAS, the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, vide Notifications No. S. O. 157 (E) of 27.02.1996 and S. O. 730 (E) dated 10.07.2002, has delegated the powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board, to issue directions to any industry or any local body or

any other authority for violations of the standards and rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 and amendment thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Unit (M/s. AAA Spinners, E-33, Industrial Area, District Panipat, Haryana) is directed to close all the plant operations with immediate effect and shall not resume its operation till following are complied with and written permission is obtained from CPCB:

1. The Unit shall carry out adequacy assessment of Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) from reputed government institute and accordingly upgrade & operate ETP properly so as to achieve prescribed standards for effluent discharge.
2. The Unit shall obtain the permission from CGWA for ground water extraction and maintain daily logbook for ground water extraction from bore well.
3. The Unit shall dismantle the freshwater pipeline provided between tube settler and filtration system at ETP.
4. The Unit shall dispose of their boiler ash in a scientific manner.

In case of failure to comply with the said directions necessary action as deemed fit under the provision of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 will be taken by Central Pollution Control Board.
