Sub.: Directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986- Show cause Notice

WHEREAS, the Pharmaceutical industries are identified as one of the 17 categories of highly polluting industries which have been discharging environmental pollutants directly or indirectly into the ambient air and water, having potential threat to cause adverse effect on the water and air quality; and

WHEREAS, the Central Government has notified the standards for discharge of environmental pollutants from various categories of industries under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules framed thereunder; and

WHEREAS, there is need to inculcate habit of self-monitoring within the industries for complying with the prescribed standards and this can be achieved by the methods like installing online effluent and emission monitoring devices; and

WHEREAS, Pharmaceutical unit M/s Syn Finechem Pvt. Ltd., D-151, Phase-III, IDA, Jeedimetla, Hyderabad, Telangana (herein after referred to as the unit) was randomly selected for inspection based on the SMS alerts generated through the OCEMS and


WHEREAS, the unit was inspected by a team of official(s) from the CPCB on February 16, 2021 to assess the adequacy of the existing pollution control measures and observed the following shortcomings:

1. An effluent sample was collected from HTDS tank-1 from where effluent is sent to MEE of CETP (JETL) and analysis results indicate that the sample is not complying with the inlet standard of CETP w.r.t COD 76,582 mg/l > 15,000 mg/l. The other set of sample which was analysed by M/s Lawn Enviro Associates, Hyderabad was also exceeding w.r.t COD parameter (99,974 mg/l > 50,000 mg/l).
2. The unit has not maintained log book for water consumption and the effluent generation quantity indicates that the actual water consumption is more than the consent limit of 36 KL/month.
3. The effluent generation from HTDS is 20 KL/month which is higher than the consented quantity of 18 KL/month.
4. The unit is washing drum and barrel in the premises for which permission in the consent has not been obtained from Telangana SPCB.
5. The VOC absorption system has not installed at the vent in the production block.
6. The unit has not adopted measures to improve solvent recovery and overall solvent recovery efficiency is 70% which is less than desired 95%.
7. The unit has not provided pH meter at the scrubber attached to the reactor vent.
8. The unit is generating 250 Kg/ month of spent carbon (HW) against the consent limit of 40 Kg/month.
9. The unit has not provided proper display board at the entrance gate as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court direction.
10. The camera feed is available but PTZ controls are not working and historical data feed was also not available.

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and climate change, Government of India, vide Notifications No. S. O. 157 (E) of 27.02.1996 and S. O. 730 (E) dated 10.07.2002, has delegated the powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) to the Chairman, Central Pollution Control Board, to issue directions to any industry or any local body or any other authority for violations of the standards and rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 and amendment thereof; and


NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of powers vested under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, a notice is hereby served to the unit **M/s Syn Finechem Pvt. Ltd., D-151, Phase-III, IDA, Jeedimetla, Hyderabad, Telangana** to show cause why the unit should not be closed down as the unit is not complying with respect to the above mentioned observations of the inspecting team.

You are hereby given an opportunity to file your objections (if any) to the above directions within 15 days from the receipt of this notice, failing which action as deemed fit under the provision of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 will be taken by CPCB.
