

Zoning Atlas for Siting Industries - Sundargarh, Orissa

Foreword

Prevention is better than cure. This is particularly true in case of industrial pollution. Lack of planned development can put the environment to high risks due to poor land use compatibility over exploitation of resources etc. Much of the problems of pollution and costs thereof can be avoided by preventing indiscriminate siting of industrial units. An important pre-requisite for judicious siting of industries is to consider the environmental profiles of the proposed sites. The Central Pollution Control Board has taken a lead in identifying environmentally compatible industrial zones. In order to delineate areas that are suitable for industrial siting and for classification of different areas based on their existing environmental features, a project for preparation of District-wise Zoning Atlas has been taken up by the Central
