OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub. : - Extension of Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944 to the employees after retirement – reg.

The Central Pollution Control Board in its 189th meeting held on the 17th December, 2019, approved extension of Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944 to the employees of CPCB post retirement. The following guidelines will be applicable for availing post-retirement medical facilities under CS(MA) Rules, 1944:

- i. The Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944 will be applicable prospectively who will be superannuating in due course of time including their dependents family members.
- ii. The dependency of family members will be as defined in the Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944.
- iii. The employee applying for CS(MA) facilities post retirement will have to deposit one-time contribution equal to 10 years for lifetime as defined in the below table depending upon the level of pay at the time of retirement.

S. No.	Corresponding levels in the pay Matrix as per 7 th CPC	Contribution per months (Rs.)	One-time contribution (Rs.)
1.	Level 1 to 5	250	30,000
2.	Level 6	450	54,000
3.	Level 7 to 11	650	78,000
4.	Level 12 and above	1000	1,20,000

- iv. Authorization letter is required each time whenever the employee takes treatment in Indoor Patient Department (IPD) from any of the hospital(s) empaneled by CPCB.
- v. The employees can avail the medical treatment from the hospitals empaneled by CPCB either on cashless basis or on payment basis as per agreement executed between CPCB and the Hospital(s).

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- vi. In case of treatment on payment basis either in the hospital or from AMA's the bills will have to be submitted to CPCB for reimbursement in the prescribed format within a period of 6 months from the date of completion of treatment. The reimbursement will be restricted to the rates as prescribed under CGHS/CS(MA) Rules. In case the hospital/AMA charge over and above the rates prescribed under CGHS/CS(MA) Rules, it has to be borne by the individual.
- vii. Pathological/Laboratory Tests may be under taken on the advice of the empaneled hospital or Authorized Medical Attendants (AMA). The Pathological/Laboratory Tests may be undertaken from the authorized diagnostics centers/hospitals on the rates prescribed under CGHS/CS(MA) Rules.
- viii. If an employee or his dependent family member(s) take treatment from the hospital(s) other than empaneled by CPCB, the hospital must be in the recognized list of CGHS/State Government.
- ix. In case the treatment is taken in any of the hospital in Out Patient Department (OPD) or from any Authorized Medical Attendants (AMA), the payment of consultation charges and prescribed medicine/pathological/laboratory tests charges will have to be paid by the individuals and will be reimbursed subsequently on submission of claim(s) to office in prescribed format as admissible.
- x. The post-retirement medical benefits will be available to the employees only after depositing the one-time contribution as indicated in the para 1(iii) above at the time of his retirement.
- xi. The post-retirement benefits under CS(MA) Rules, 1944 will be effective from the date of issue of this Office Memorandum.
